Lastly, the song <u>"Feed the Birds"</u> from the classic Mary Poppins film has taught generations of children the importance of being kind to those around them with less. <u>According to legend</u>, it was Walt Disney's personal favorite song and has been called the <u>"best Disney song ever written"</u> as it exalts the act of pure charity to others who can't give you anything in return.

I hope these ideas inspire you to teach your children to be observant about the world around them, empowered that even as children they can make a positive impact in someone's day-to-day life.
